What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests primarily in North American securities and may also invest in foreign securities. The fund will use alternative investment strategies including the use of leverage. The leverage will be created through the use of cash borrowings, short sales and derivative contracts. The fund's leverage must not exceed 300% the fund's net asset value. The leverage will be calculated in accordance with the methodology prescribed by securities laws

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.



How has the fund performed?

YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS

This chart shows how Class F units of the fund have performed in each of the past 2 calendar years. The fund did not drop in value in any of those years. AVERAGE RETURN

The annual compounded return of Class F units of the fund was 6.1% since inception. If you had invested \$1,000 in the fund since inception, your investment would be now worth \$1,170.

Who is this fund for?

This fund is suitable for investors who want income and the long-term potential growth of their capital. This fund is suitable for investors who want to invest in a multi-strategy liquid alternative fund. Investors in this fund should have a long-term investment time horizon and a low tolerance for investment risk.

A word about tax

In general, you pay income tax on your share of the fund's earnings and on any gains you realize from redeeming your investment. The amount of tax depends on the tax rules and rates that apply to you, and whether you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as an RRSP or TFSA.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Class F units of the fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among classes of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. SALES CHARGES

There are no sales charges for Class F units of the fund.

2. FUND EXPENSES

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns. The fund will pay to the Manager a performance fee in relation to Class F units that is equal to 15% of the amount by which the total return of the Class F units exceeds a 3% hurdle rate, for the period since the performance fee was last paid, subject to accumulation in years where no performance fee is paid, provided that the total return of the Class F units for such period exceeds the previous high-water mark, exclusive of taxes. The performance fee is calculated as described in the Simplified Prospectus on a daily basis and paid annually. As of December 31, 2024, the expenses of Class F were 2.45% of the value of this class. This equals \$24.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

3. OTHER FEES

Fee-based account fee	You may pay a fee-based account fee, which is negotiated between you and your representative, and paid directly to your representative's firm. What if I change my mind?

Under the securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document; or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.


